Welcome and Introductions

- Meeting called to order @ 6:00pm.
- Review of agenda.

Introduction - Erin Badesso

- Safety update First Aid etc.
- o Action item update

Tsawak-qin Operational Update – Brian Marcus

- o Operating in Silverside only area that needs boat to access currently
- o Building road in Henderson
- Planting has started with contractor Sitka Silviculture
- Less harvesting so far in 2024
 – partially for market and partially due to cutting permits not being issued

PEFC Update - Will Sloan

- Will was on a call this morning with member from Hungary to go through new endorsements
- o Recommendation is that new standard will be done hopefully by September
- o 3rd party going through standard
- o If there are concerns, they are to be allowed to be given until the end of the vear
- 1 year transition period
- o Will Sloan will have more information at next visit this November
- o TBD when standard out
- European deforestation regulation update in November
- Will is retiring at the end of 2024, he and Jonathan will be doing at introductions at every operation to give him a proper send off/transition

Tethered Harvesting Presentation and His Bio – Jonathan Flintoft

- He worked on TFL44 for 6 years, came onto WFP in 2006 and transferred to Port McNeill – during the transition to combined Weyerhaeuser with WFP in Port McNeill
- o Ran public advisory group in Port McNeill

Presentation

Developed in New Zealand to overcome challenged harvesting on steep slopes

- o 2010 is when it got started, was used on the northern island in 2015
- Safety is the main cause of function, danger trees and windfall cause many hazards
- Environment is another cause, machines cause erosion with rain etc., with having traction assist it helps with less spinning on ground
- o Can be used for 35-65% slope
- o Enhances quality in volume recovery
- o Need a minimum volume to make sure this process works efficiently
- The equipment winch plays a large part in this process, needs a good trail and place to set up, road at top of block for winch placement
- Brian Marcus identified that tethered falling has been used once so far in TFL44 in Thomas – some minor soil disturbance, wouldn't want in wet areas, need to analyze the site to see if it is the best plan
- Another idea is to attach a winch to a hoe chucker rather than using a grapple varder
- Images were shown of the machinery for a better idea of what these processes entail
- o Road building equipment was modified to be a winch
- o 0 accidents so far

Forest Operations Map – Brian Marcus

- o FOM is acronym
- o Came into affect April 1st
- o Website is www.tfl44lp.com to see FOMs under forest stewardship plan tab
- Before applying for a cutting permit or road permit a FOM must be posted on gov site
- A map of approx. area of harvesting/road building (any area being permitted) is posted onto the Alberni Valley News for 30 days and posted onto the TFL44 website to receive comments
- Questions received from TPAG included: licences to which FOM applies; definition of "public" in the legislation; does the company need to adopt all comments received; can the District Manager deny an application based on unaddressed comments received from the public; how many roads/cutblocks can be included in a FOM; in what newspaper(s) do FOMs need to be advertised; does the public see a report on the comments received; does the record of the FOM vanish after 30 day
- Applies to all tenures with a Forest Stewardship Plan including woodlots
- o Idea to send notice out to PAG members to be notified when a FOM is posted
- o Comments can be made by public on a FOM for 30 days
- Licensees are not obligated to incorporate all public comments received, but all must be taken into consideration
- Option to email comments, send by mail or can make an appointment to come to office and say comments in person
- o This will include an overview map of everything included on a FOM then smaller individual maps with more detail
- Must create a report for government with proof of being in a local paper, map, and descriptions of comments
- o Government may refuse to issue a road or cutting permit based on significant comments received.

- Important to use number on the map for the cutblock or road to use to specifically comment on it
- A FOM has a 3-year period to be harvested or to build the road or else a new FOM is required
- o No limit to how many blocks or roads in a FOM
- Brian to send PowerPoint to group so they can have access to info and links (action item)
- Due to low turn out, show presentation again for awareness and Brian can give update on comments at a later meeting once there have been more FOMs posted
- Plan to have first FOM out next week
- o After 30 days, FOM will be taken off and won't be able to view

TPAG Satisfaction Survey 2023 – Erin Badesso

- o 10 respondents
- Tied to indicator 6.1.1 numerical score, and they all have a value to come out with a final number
- Value 1.45 which means on average means TPAG is satisfied-very satisfied with the process
- o A slightly better satisfaction score than in 2022
- o A member commented that they would like a fisheries rep
- Encouragement to keep participating in the survey so the process can continue to improve
